### Dear Parents,

I want to take a moment to address the importance of play, and focus on why we feel our play based preschool fosters learning at the child's level. Play is how children learn about their world. Children learn social skills by playing with others. Play helps children to solve problems in an environment that is supportive to the process. Children also develop critical



thinking skills necessary to ask questions and figure out how things work. Through these activities, children continue to strengthen their language development. According to Dr. David Elkind, who wrote the book <u>The Power of Play</u>, "Learning teaches us what is known, play makes it possible for new things to be learned. There are many concepts and skills that can only be learned through play." Some parents regard play as rather trivial in the lives of their preschoolers, and would rather see their children in formal games, educational classes, and organized sports. However, research suggests that free play may actually be healthier for your children than structured activities. Play helps children make sense of and find their place in the world. There is a close link between play and healthy cognitive growth. It lays the foundation for later academic success in reading and writing. It provides hands on experiences with real life materials that help children develop abstract scientific and mathematical concepts. Play is critical for the development of imagination and creative problem-solving skills. Most experts in play research believe a balance approach is best. There should be good opportunity for genuine free play as well as some active involvement of adults in structuring some play.

So, when you pick up your child from preschool and ask what they did at school today you will know all that they mean when they reply, "I just played!"

I am looking forward to seeing everyone at our upcoming Gala on Saturday, March 7<sup>th</sup>. It is sure to be a fun celebration!
